

“I Need a Smoke Alarm for My House but Can’t Purchase One”

You may recognize that you need a smoke alarm for your house but for various reasons, may not be able to obtain one for yourself.

Central Ohio is unique in that several fire departments are working together so that you can have a smoke alarm for your home at no cost.

If you need a smoke alarm and have no other means of getting one, the graph to the right shows fire and EMS agencies in your community that may be able to help you obtain a smoke alarm. [Contact your local fire department for information about how their program works.](#)

Who is Eligible for this Program

In order to participate in this program, you must:

- Be in your own home.
- Not be a renter (your landlord is required by law to have a working smoke detector in your home).
- Live in the fire district of the fire agency that you are asking to get the smoke detector from.

Fire & Smoke Alarm Facts

Consider these national trends on fires and smoke alarms:

- Approximately 3,500 people die every year as a result of a residential fire¹.
- A house fire occurs every 82 seconds².
- In less than 30 seconds a small flame can get completely out of control³.
- Smoke and toxic gases kill more people than flames do³.
- Young children and the elderly are those least able to get out of a house that is on fire⁴.
- Having a working smoke alarm dramatically increases your chances of surviving a fire³.
- Almost two-thirds of home fire deaths resulted from fires in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms².
