Whether it's from violence, abuse, a profound loss, or exposure to dire situations inherent to one's profession, trauma can adversely affect a survivor's outlook on life and their ability to interact with the world.

The Stress, Trauma and Resilience (STAR) Trauma Recovery Center at OSU is comprised of a dedicated team whose sole purpose is the identification, education and treatment of those who have survived trauma.

OSU STAR Trauma Recovery Center

Services

- Resources & support when a patient is hospitalized
- Clinical case management to provide emergency assistance to meet basic needs such as food, shelter, clothing, safety, and support to gain or re-build stability
- Advocacy & education about victims' rights and the legal process
- Assistance in communicating with law enforcement (as applicable)
- Trauma-focused psychotherapy
- Assertive outreach in the community to build relationships, earn trust, and offer education & support to those most vulnerable and at-risk in underserved populations and neighborhoods

How is the program funded?

Utilizing grant funding supported by the federal Victims of Crime Act (VOCA), OSU STAR Trauma Recovery Center is able to provide services free of charge to eligible participants.

Who is eligible to participate?

Adult survivors of crime-related violence are eligible for services. A limited number of services are also available to survivors whose trauma does not meet VOCA grant eligibility requirements.
